Equipment

AFTT's in-house theatre is fully equipped with professional quality lighting, sound, seating and staging. Our film students have access to the latest ARRI Amiras with ARRI follow focus and matte boxes, Blackmagic URSA Mini Pros and RED Epics and RED Scarlets, used to shoot films such as *The Hobbit*, Lord of the Rings, The Great Gatsby, Captain America: The Winter Soldier and The Social Network among others.

Lighting and sound equipment includes ARRI, aDEDO and HMI lighting; Steadicam Flyer and Easyrig scorpion camera support systems; Sennheiser and Sony radio lapel microphone kits, Rode shotgun mics and Premix 3 recorder mixers and an extensive range of professional tripods, dollies, jibs and prime lens kits.

Diploma of Creative Arts (Acting)

AFTT's Diploma of Creative Arts (Acting) comprises the first two (2) trimesters of our Degree program, providing an exit point for students wishing to develop introductory acting skills and providing a pathway for further learning.

The presence of smaller and multipurpose performance venues has created a landscape of opportunity for small scale performances, projects and productions. New and emerging technologies provide greater accessibility to resources for creating film and digital media content, whilst the emergence of online platforms have created new ways for an audience to interact with performance.

This course equips students with underpinning skills and knowledge to apply foundational acting principles to performances, to develop creative and collaborative performance concepts and provides the necessary educational and academic framework to enable further study.

Bachelor of Creative Arts (Acting)

AFTT's Bachelor of Creative Arts (Acting) has been designed to equip actors with the versatility to move between theatre, film, television and digital performance media; to claim ownership of their

individual acting process; develop their personal resilience and to have the capacity to generate their own creative work opportunities.

Our course provides many practical and real-world opportunities to develop the actor's skill and technique, coupled with a broad and coherent theoretical and technical knowledge base of the profession and the industry.

Course Overview

A great live production requires more than a good script and performers. A clear artistic vision, combined with a whole range of technical and production skill must be applied to bring a production to life and engage its audience. Theatre producers interpret that artistic vision and manage the technical elements required to take a production from first script read through to standing ovation.

AFTT's theatre production course provides students with a practical understanding of the whole theatre production process. With fundamental technical skills integrated throughout the course and applied to real-world theatre productions, students are fully immersed in the live production process.

Thanks to our collaborative campus, actors and producers work seamlessly together on a range of in-house and external shows. By working on a range of productions large and small, students gain a true understanding of the skills and knowledge required to be a great all-rounder for any production position.

CUA50420 Diploma of Live Production and Technical Services (Stage Management)

The Diploma will equip you with the core skills required to work in a Stage Manager or Theatre Technician role in a theatre production, while also being exposed to a range of other roles in the live production industry. Fifteen (15) units of competency have been carefully chosen to reflect the versatility required to work in the industry, and to ensure you graduate equipped with the knowledge and experience to navigate a successful and long-lasting career.

The Theatre Production course revolves around industry best practice: analysing and interpreting scripts; scheduling and managing the cast and crew from rehearsals to final performance; sourcing and making props, and preparing and operating all technical elements, including front of house communication, show calling and more.

Throughout the course you will be mentored by industry professionals – including stage managers, technicians, directors and lighting, sound and set designers – whose aim is to guide you into a successful career within the live production industry (theatre, live entertainment or festivals).

Graduates of this course will have the confidence to work on a wide range of productions and events, including independent small-scale plays. They will also be given the opportunity to explore the live production industry.

HOW TO APPLY

International students must meet the following criteria:

- Evidence (written in English) of successful completion of a Senior Secondary Certificate or equivalent;
- English language proficiency equivalent to IELTS 5.5 with no band score below 5.0 for Film and Theatre Production courses, and 6.0 with no band score below 5.5 for Acting courses;
- Personal statement about you and why you want to study at AFTT;
- Must be 18 years or older at time of course commencement:
- Interview:
- Audition (Acting applicants only).

Enrolment steps:

- 1. Fill out an application online or use our printed application form.
- 2. Submit the following documents:
 - Certified transcripts (translated if necessary)
 - Evidence of English language proficiency
 - Personal statement
- 3. Course specific requirements:
 - Acting: We will advise you about your audition so you can start preparing;
 - Theatre Production: Include examples of prior experience in your personal statement;
- 4. We will contact you to arrange an interview (in person or through video conference);
- 5. We issue an offer letter and other important enrolment papers;
- 6. Pay tuition fees and arrange overseas student health cover;
- 7. We issue a Confirmation of Enrolment:

Auditions

Applicants for Acting must audition for a place in the course. Auditions can be carried out in two (2) ways: live or via video submission.

Live Audition

Applicants who are able to attend a live audition will be encouraged to do so. Auditions are held several times throughout the year in Sydney. They are conducted in individual and group-based scenarios. Auditions are designed to ensure we have the opportunity to see the best from you. During the process we will be able to provide you with the constructive feedback and guidance you require to grow as a performer. Audition booklets are available to help you prepare.

Video Audition

Applicants residing outside of Australia may submit a solo video audition. Audition booklets containing relevant monologues will be emailed and a time frame given in which to prepare the video. No effects are necessary – applicants' faces must be clearly visible to camera and their voice must be heard clearly.

Further guidance on auditions will be given during the application process.









STUDENT MATTERS

Orientation

A student orientation session is held at the beginning of the course. Students also meet an assigned mentor, from Student Admissions, who can provide guidance on a variety of matters regarding the move to Australia.

Teaching and Assessment

AFTT uses a combination of assessment methods, including written documentation, questioning, direct observation and screening presentations. Students will receive in-class assessment of skills and knowledge, followed by opportunities to integrate those skills into an industry setting. Students are assessed using a combination of methods including direct observation, journaling, questioning, portfolio submission and written assignments.

Modes of Study

All courses are offered full-time and are delivered on AFTT premises. Learning opportunities off-campus, including projects and excursions, may also be provided.

Textbooks

Students may be required to purchase textbooks during their studies, though many reading materials and resources will be offered in class.

Additional resources may be referred to throughout the course. Students may borrow DVDs, plays and texts from the Academy library. Costumes and props may be borrowed for use in student productions, and filming equipment may also be borrowed.

Health Cover

Students are required to obtain Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) for themselves and any accompanying family members for the duration of their student visa.

Student Visas

Students are strongly advised to contact the Australian diplomatic mission in their country or one of our agent representatives. For information about visa eligibility and general visa procedures, please visit https://immi.homeaffairs.gov.au/visas/getting-a-visa/visa-listing/student-500 prior to applying to study. Any school-aged dependants accompanying students to Australia may be required to pay full fees if they are enrolled in either a government or non-government school.

Accommodation and Living Expenses

The cost of living in Sydney depends largely on lifestyle, choice of accommodation and social life. As a general guide, students can expect to spend an average of AU\$410 per week on rent, food and public transport. This does not allow for entertainment, study, private transport, utilities or clothing costs. Whilst accommodation is not available on campus, AFTT staff can suggest suitable accommodation services within reasonable proximity to the campus.

ESOS Framework - Education Services for Overseas Students

The Australian Government wants overseas students in Australia to have a safe, enjoyable and rewarding place to study.
